Friday 14 May – Courtesy of Dougarie Estates a Stableford team match has been arranged with the Machrie Bay Golf Club. This is a 9-hole club and will be played twice. Each team will be made up of two SDGP players (either a disabled golfer and coach or two disabled players) and two club members. The first tee will be at approximately 13:00.

Saturday 15 May – Courtesy of Lamlash Golf Club, a team Stableford match has been arranged with the members and Committee. This is an 18-hole golf course and there are golf buggies available. Each team will be made up of two SDGP players (either a disabled golfer and coach or two disabled players) and two club members. The first tee will be at 10:00.

Golf carts are available at Lamlash, but not at Machrie Bay, which is a flat course. It is your responsibility to arrange booking and payments with the golf club on arrival.

\* Investigations are being made into ferries and transport. Currently, one mini-bus will travel from the East and one from the West, again this transport will be organised and allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

Please note, that at any SDGP golf event, all participants are responsible for their own existing medical conditions and actions, and no liability will be accepted by the SDGP or our event partners for any injury or damage to person or property.
